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## INTRODUCTION

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**T**hank you for your participation in the Roman's series! We greatly value your investment in the lives of others as you minister to them through his Word. Know that we are praying specifically for you and your group as together we embark on this journey through the Book of Romans.

### **Mission**

Spiritual formation happens best in context of spiritual community. The benefit of Small Group Ministry is that we have the opportunity to engage the Scriptures in the context of our lives. As we understand and engage God, as we are transformed by his Word and his Spirit, we will increasingly become transformed to the image of Christ. The change in us, brought about by the work of the Spirit, will affect all of our relationships. It is a process that will happen slowly over time—God's timing. Our mission, therefore, is to not just impart knowledge acquisition, but as we are changed, guide others through a process of continual transformation. The study questions are designed to assist you through both knowledge and application and are based on the following criteria:

- What has God revealed about himself and about us?
- How do these truths impact our relationships?
- How does this challenge me personally? What potential transformation needs to take place?
- Can I identify areas of resistance?
- What is the work of the Spirit? How can I cooperate?

Although some lessons may lend themselves to a greater emphasis in one area over another, we will attempt to follow this criteria throughout these lessons.
