Guilty As Charged

Read Romans 3:9-20 and answer the following questions:

1. (3:9) What can we conclude?

2. (3:10-12) How many are righteous before God?

3. (3:13-14) How does their sin express itself?

4. (3:15-17) How does their sin express itself?

5. (3:18) What is the root/cause of their sin?

6. (3:19) What is the conclusion?

Personal Reflection

According to verses 10-12, we are all guilty of sin. No one is righteous. In what ways are we prone to justify our sin; to deny it, marginalize it, or try to make up for it?

7. (3:20) What does the law not do? What does it accomplish?

In verses 13-14, the Apostle Paul lists sins of speech; words we use to harm others. Why begin with more “simplistic” sin?

8. What is the final conclusion of Romans 1:18 - 3:20? See especially 2:1 and 3:19.

In an unregenerate state, we all disregard God (vs. 18). How are we tempted to disregard God today?

As it is written: “There is no one righteous, not even one; there is no one who understands, no one who seeks God. All have turned away, they have together become worthless; there is no one who does good, not even one.”
